Outreach Ideas

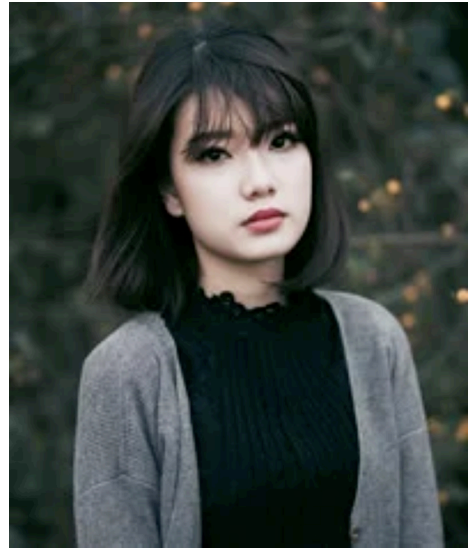
