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Kunigami in Japan



Thvn closely related people groups living in the Ryukyu Islands. Kunigami women are traditionally kept in subjection to their husbands. At celebrations, the men stay separated from the women, usually drinking sake (rice wine). The Kunigami are Buddhist, but traditional shamanistic practices are still prevalent. They believe in many unseen gods, demons, and ancestral spirits. The father of the house maintains the religious rituals in the home and cares for the ancestral tombs. The women serve as mediators between the kami (invisible spiritual powers) and the people. The people must seek permission from the kami before making any type of decision.



Ministry Obstacles

No scripture is reported to be available in the Kunigami language, nor are there other resources such as gospel recordings. However, many of the younger Kunigami people speak Japanese.

Outreach Ideas

Christians in nearby American military installations can take the initiative to befriend island people such as the Kunigami, and as the Lord leads, tell them about Jesus.
