Thai Isan in the United States



The Northeastern Thai, also known as the Lao Isan, are one of the Thai peoples that have migrated in small numbers to the US. Some have come as students, others as brides, but all come as Buddhists. Those who have come to the US easily blend in socially with the more numerous Central Thai people.

Ministry Obstacles

It is very difficult to get a Thai Issan person to get beyond the belief that "to be Thai Issan is to be Buddhist," no matter where they live.

Pray for Northeastern Thai Isan people in the US to put their worth in God, not in the world system.
