Kashmiri Pandit Brahmins in Delhi, India



Kashmiri Pandit Brahmins in India are facing extinction. Since 1990, the population of the Kashmiri Pandits has declined considerably. The birth rate among the Pandits is one of the lowest in India, and they have a high mortality rate. The women have complications with their reproductive systems, and many are reaching menopause at the age of 35. Kashmiris are showing premature aging, a decline in mental development, and a lack of desire to live.

Ministry Obstacles

Today, many Pandits live in refugee camps because they were forced from their Kashmiri homes by extremist Muslims. Restricted access to them may require prayer and unique open doors.

Outreach ideas

Kashmiri Pandits are educated people and still maintain their ancient occupations of Hindu priests, scholars, and teachers. Others work as public servants and in law, engineering, computer science, and medicine. Opportunities within these fields may offer opportunities for believers to
